## **CVH FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES KATHY HAY AS NEW PRESIDENT AND CEO**

MISSISSAUGA, ON — Michael Kilkenny, Chairman of The Credit Valley Hospital Foundation Board of Directors, is pleased to announce the appointment of Ms. Kathy Hay to the position of President and CEO of The Credit Valley Hospital Foundation.

"After an extensive search, I am confident the Board has selected the best person to move this Foundation forward and the Lifetime of Care \$45 million campaign to completion," said Mr. Kilkenny. "Kathy's talent, energy and strong leadership ability is evident and truly inspiring."

Hay is a senior fundraising professional with considerable experience in the Mississauga community. She is currently the Associate Vice President, Advancement at the University of Guelph.

Prior to this role, she was the Executive Director of Advancement at the University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM), leading the advancement team to unprecedented levels and the successful completion of the Hazel McCallion Academic Learning Centre campaign. She previously worked as a Senior Development Officer at UTM, Director of Development for Big Brothers Big Sisters of Peel, and Director of Development of Families and Children Experiencing AIDS. In addition, she revitalized – with the Canadian Consul-General – the first ex-patriot fundraising organization in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Called the Canadian Foundation and with Hay serving as president, the successful organization raised funds for underprivileged children and seniors.

Hay is a graduate of the University of Waterloo with a BA in psychology and economics and started her career in the financial services sector with CIBC.

Hay sat on Mayor McCallion's *Our Future* advisory board for the City of Mississauga and is a member of the Advocacy Committee for the United Way of Peel Region. An avid runner, she has worked with the Children's Aid Society of Peel Region to help launch a fully funded mentorship program with marginalized youth and adult runners. In the past, she has served on the board of directors of Supportive Housing in Peel and FoodPath.

"As a resident of Mississauga, I am privileged to be raising funds for Credit Valley Hospital, a first class hospital right in our backyard," said Hay. "I look forward to working with our donors, our hospital family, and our entire community to help build and equip this much-needed hospital expansion."

Hay assumes her new role at Credit Valley in April. She succeeds Norma Bandler who after 18 years of dedicated service and more than \$75 million raised for The Credit Valley Hospital is retiring.
